# All that I see, all that I wonder Ron Siu

#### Phenakistoscope Instructions

A phenakistoscope is an analogue form of animation device displaying short, looping animations. Use the instructions below to engage with these contemporary phenokistoscopes by artist Ron Siu.

- 1. Carefully remove a phenakistoscope from its holder.
- 2. Position yourself in front of the mirror and hold the phenakistoscope close to your face, with the image side facing the mirror.
- 3. Look through one of the slits. You should see the image-side reflected in the mirror.
- 4. Close one eye and give the phenakistoscope a hard spin so that it rotates quickly. As you focus on the image reflected in the mirror, the illusion of motion is created.
  - \*Play with adjusting the speed of the spin or your distance from the mirror if you have trouble with the animation. Please ask a member of staff if you require any assistance.
